Agave & Friends

Maguey (Mah-Gay')—a type of agave—was one of the most cherished plants in ancient Mexican culture. Often used in religious rituals, it was believed to be home to the goddess Mayahuel and was used to make everything from clothing and tools to the sacred beverage pulque (Pool'-Kay). When the Spanish brought alambic pot stills from the Moorish territories with them to the New World, BAM! mezcal, tequila, and sotol were born. NOM stands for Normas Official Mexicana and indicates a government assigned serial number to the distillery where these spirits originate.

Tequila

BLANCO

Much like champagne is a type of wine that must come from Champagne, France, tequila is a type of mezcal that must come from around the town of Tequila. The town of Tequila is within the state of Jalisco and by law, tequila must be made from blue weber agave. Urban legend says that due to the early popularity of tequila, the unregulated proliferation of agave farms and over-harvesting of trees as a heat source has now led to the tequila process switching from wood-fired hearths to cleaner gas-fired ovens. This is why tequila is typically cleaner tasting than other types of mezcal.

Blancos are unaged, Reposados are aged in barrel between two and twelve months, Anejo are aged between one and three years, and anything older are considered Extra Anejo.

Mercal

Basically, everything from Mexico distilled from agave is mezcal, though in conventional terms, when the term mezcal is used, it implies smokier, earthier spirits from the state of Oaxaca (there are a few other certified regions scattered in six other states). Modern production of mezcal usually involves baking the heart of the agave plant in wood-fired, earthen ovens, resulting in layers of deep and smokey flavors. These are artisanal, alambic copper-pot distilled spirits made by families that harvest by hand most of these plants in the wild; this is not the stuff preserving worms in Tarantino movies. Some, like the Real Minero spirits, are even distilled in ultra-traditional clay pot-stills, a rare treat even in Mexico.

Sotol y Raicilla

Sotol, the state drink of Chihuahua, Durango, and Coahuila, is the distilled spirit of the Sotol (aka Desert Spoon) plant, a similarly spikey-looking ex-cousin to the agave family of plants from which mezcal and tequila are produced. Flavor-wise, sotol is a great gateway between tequila and mezcal: a touch earthier and smokier than tequila without being too intense, milder and softer than mezcal with much complexity. Raicilla was traditionally known as the moonshine of Jalisco and produced outside of the constraints and supervision of the law.

Bourbon

Bourbon is the pride and joy of our great nation. Read: more American than apple pie. Bourbon must be made anywhere in these United States and by law must be from mostly corn, but can also have rye, barley, and/or (more rarely) wheat blended in. The breakdown as the actual recipe is referred to as the "mash bill". See illustration to the left.

Bourbons with * are made with recipes utilizing wheat.

BUFFALO TRACE DISTILLERY - FRANKFORT, KY

Kentucky Colonel Edmund Haynes Taylor, Jr. is not only the founding father of Buffalo Trace Distillery but is also known as the father of the modern Bourbon industry. In the late 1800's, Taylor teamed up with St. Louis whiskey salesman George T. Stagg, instantly making Buffalo Trace the squad to beat in the American whiskey game.

Made from at least 51% rye with the balance being typically corn and barley, rye is often much more intense, fuller flavored, an less sweet. If you like bourbon, but sometimes fantasize about jazz hands and rippling arm muscles, rye may be your thing.

SAZERAC - FRANKFORT, KY

There once was a liquor from France named Sazerac, that bartenders in New Orleans used in a cocktail. They called the cocktail Sazerac, and it became so beloved that the bar itself eventually came to be known as Sazerac Coffee House. Then along comes Thomas H. Handy and his suitcase full of money. Thomas bought the bar, then founded a liquor company, and named that company Sazerac.

MGPI, FKA LDI - LAWRENCEBURG, INDIANA

Rye whiskey is notoriously difficult to distill. Consequently, many small companies actually purchase their rye from an enormous, highly technically proficient facility in Indiana now owned by a company called MGPI. That said, really smart and talented people are able to walk through the lobby of MGPI, fka LDI, and hand select individual barrels that they believe are superior to all the other barrels. The characters of these whiskies, as evidenced by the range of flavors and brands encompassed below, are often nothing short of extraordinary.



Single Distillery Scotch

The vast majority of Scotland's whiskies end up in blends like Dewar's or Johnnie Walker. Those brands buy the output from different distilleries or use the distillate from facilities they own then mix it up to suit their own house style. There's absolutely nothing wrong with that. The forthcoming sections, however, are distillate from individual sites, with inimitable characters, like solo voices soaring through, rather than the pleasantly homogonous thrum of a well-trained choir. Most of these are single malts, i.e. entirely from malted barley, but a few are even single grain Scotch whiskies, made from other grains like corn, oats, wheat, and/or unmalted barley.

The following Scotch whiskies are categorized by region.

SPEYSIDE

Once considered a mere subregion of the Highlands, Speyside is now home to about half of all Scotland's distilleries, including some of the world's most famous producers such as the Macallan and Glenlivet. They typically make for a rich, smooth, opulent, style that is unpeated.

Peat - noun - def: a brown, soil-like material characteristic of boggy, acid ground, consisting of partly decomposed vegetable matter. Peat was historically burned for heat in certain parts of Scotland and is still used to make some whiskies.

Japanese Whisky

In 1918, a young Japanese man from a sake-brewing family named Masataka Taketsuru traveled to Glasgow. Once there, he fell deeply in love with the land, Scotch whisky, and a young Scottish lass named Jessica Roberts. Defying society and sobriety, they quietly married, returned to Japan, and brought with them the knowledge of Scotch whisky production.

Upon returning, Taketsuru found himself under the employ of the beverage company Suntory, which directed him to build Yamazaki, Japan's first whisky distillery, in 1923. When his contract expired, Taketsuru-san went out on his own, founding the Nikka Whisky Company and the Yoichi Distillery in 1934.

Best exemplified by Yamazaki and unlike most single malt producers in Scotland, Japan's distilleries typically house a variety of stills in different shapes & sizes and use different distillation techniques, allowing for a wide palette of flavors to blend together. Yoichi, however, was Taketsuru's vision at making something unapologetically Scottish and singular in character. Like a mosquito with dinosaur DNA frozen in sap, it remains a snapshot of Scotch-style distillation 100 years ago, perhaps more "traditional" than many Scotch facilities today. Today, many more independent distilleries have popped up across Japan, including Chichibu, Mars, Kanosuke, Eigashima, Ohishi, and Fukano.

As I type this and glance below at the large selection of ultrapremium and magically high-quality Japanese whiskies, I can think of no whisky producing region that has a brighter future.

Shochu

Shochu is a single-distilled Japanese spirit with a tradition of over 500 years, produced extensively in the southern island of Kyushu and enjoyed throughout the country. The saccharification process takes place in the presence of koji, an indispensible ingredient in Japanese fermented foods and beverages. The SG Shochu from Shingo Gokan in collaboration with three of Japan's leading shochu producers belongs to an authentic variety of artisanal shochu known in Japanese as honaku shochu, a spirit category which does not permit any additives to the distillate besides water.

The connection between India and Scotch-style whiskies might seem only natural given the historical, colonial entanglements between India and the UK, but in actuality, much of what was made and sold as whisky was predominantly from molasses, rather than grain. It wasn't until 1982, when Scotch enthusiast and heir to the Amrut distillery Neelakanta Jagdale decided to hijack his father's company, that India saw the birth of its first truly excellent malt whisky. Since then, Amrut has firmly established itself amongst Scotch fans the world over as being one of the world's leading single malt whisky-producers. Amrut punches well above its weight class in both flavor and value.
